The Chapter Mourns the passing of GYSGT. CHARLES L. BERGIN, USMC

November 7, 1925 - February 28, 2013

The old San Fernando Mission Chapel was filled to capacity with family, friends, law enforcement and fellow Marines. While outside, at grave site, a Marine Honor detail and a rifle squad with seven Marines and a NCOIC prepared to honor a decorated Marine who saw combat action in two wars, WWII, Iwo Jima and in the cold climate of Korea.

Eulogies were given by his nephew Bob Bergin, his daughter Rema Bergin, his son Tom Bergin and family friend Doug Hamlin.

Charlie had a colorful life growing up with dual citizenship, USA and Canadian. Two of his brothers entered WWII by joining the Canadian Army in 1939 while a third brother joined the U.S. Navy. That brother would lose his life on December 7, 1941 while aboard the USS Arizona. His body lies with the ship and shipmates at Pearl Harbor.

Charlie using his brothers identification card also joined the Canadian Army but was his age was uncovered just prior to shipping out to Europe and he was released from active duty. He learned that he could join the U.S Armed Forces at age 17 with his parents consent so he got his mother to sign for him and he joined the United States Marines.

Between WWII and Korea Charlie spent time on recruiting duty. Those who knew Charlie knows he could sell you just about anything. You would truly believe you just got a great deal.

I often wonder how many Marine recruits left for Boot Camp thinking the same thing. Charlie was very proud of his time with "Charlie" Company, 1st Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment.

Charlie was one of the original founders of our Chapter. In the early days he and the "Wild Bunch" of the Chapter would have some great and wild times.

As the "Wild Bunch" would come to mellow out Charlie could always be counted on to provide guidance and direction to those of us coming of age in the Chapter.

Many great stories will be told over the coming years of Charlie Bergin. His generosity, leadership, positive attitude along with his dedication to the Chapter will be missed.

Years ago, I met my son-in-law's uncle. He was introduced with the first name of "Lucky." Without exception, and until this day, everyone calls him "Lucky." He is a very quiet person. Time passed, and I was always curious about his first name. I figured he had won the lottery or hit it big in Las Vegas. While at a family function, I asked him if "Lucky" was his legal first name. He said "no" and explained. "Lucky" said he had been a PFC in the Army during World War II and had been in the infantry. Here is an overview of last years events:

As you can see there are two events that concern me and will address at the meeting.

There are two ways to insure that the Chapter does not take a loss on these events.

One, increase attendance. Second, raise the cost that each member pays to attend.

I can tell you from past experience that raising the cost of an event will drive down attendance. The only solution I can see is to increase attendance or eliminate the event.

Canceling events is the easy way out, but it will save the Chapter money. We can't afford to keep taking a loss. So canceling may be the only solution.

There are members we can count on to attend most events. It's time for all members who live with in reasonable driving distance to start attending.

Everyone should consider inviting neighbors, friends and family members. Let them experience what we as Marines have learned, a brotherhood and Esprit De Corps second to none.


