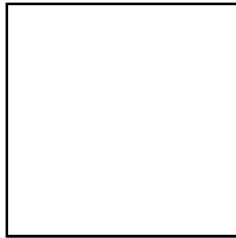

By now many of you have heard that my Dad underwent major surgery to have a malignant tumor removed from his right lung.

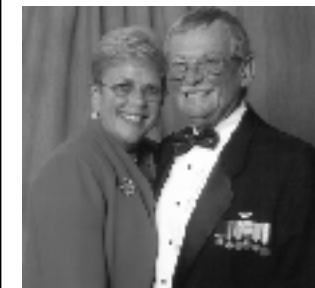
The surgery went well and the cancer was removed. However, with that said recover has been very slow. At the time of this newsletter he remains in ICU improving a little each day.

ATTENTION! I will be sending our request for cottages and/or RV spots to Del Mar Joe when I return from vacation on May 4th.

For all of you who are not familiar with the "NEW" procedures for reserving cottages for our chapter at Del Mar please read the following: I will mail the request to Del Mar Joe asking for the weekend from Friday, September 12 to Monday, September 15, 2008. I will be "requesting" 36 cottages and 10 RV/Trailer spots. I have to send that request at about 12 weeks before our event. Del Mar Joe then takes the request to his supervisor at MCCA.

If they approve the request then Del Mar Joe contacts me and lets me know that it has been approved (or denied) and how many cottages and RV spots he will allow to reserve. The number requested v/s the number authorized could be vastly different. "IF" we are allowed the number requested (or close to it) then we are good to go. "BUT," if we are given a number of cottages far less than what we wanted then the officers and directors will have to get together and decide if we want or can go ahead with the campout. Once make that decision then we will let you know. The current rental rates are: Cottages: \$70.00 a night with a 3 day minimum (\$210.00 for our week-end). Trailers/Rv's: \$35.00 a night for NON-Military and \$30.00 a NIGHT FOR military (NO minimum stay requirements).

Please **"DO NOT"** send any money until we have more definite information for you. This information hopefully will be in the JUNE issue of the chapter newsletter.
